

Summertime Learning for Kindergarten through Seventh Grade General Information

St. Matthew's Summer Session is designed to provide academic enrichment and to broaden children's experiences of formal learning. Stimulating projects in the basic academic subjects are a major focus of the program, along with the development of special skills and competencies useful in the regular classroom. Class size is limited. Active learning is implemented by creative teaching, and much is accomplished in a relaxed, yet focused, atmosphere.

Resting on 30 beautiful acres of land in the heart of Pacific Palisades, the entire St. Matthew's facility is available for summer school use. Two fully equipped computer labs, special art and music rooms, two science labs, playground and PE areas, a swimming pool, and the Sports and Performing Arts Center support the diverse course offerings and activities at the various grade levels.

St. Matthew's Summer Session is a Monday through Friday program, which offers great flexibility in scheduling. The full day program runs from 8:45 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Students may choose to attend the morning program only, which begins at 8:45 a.m. and runs until 11:50 p.m. The morning includes three class periods and a recess. Students enrolled in the afternoon program experience a variety of enjoyable learning activities, organized especially for them. The afternoon program runs from 11:50 until 3:00. Students may enroll for the entire five week session or for either of the two shorter sessions. Details are further explained in this brochure.

Our Summer Session is open to all age-eligible children, whether they attend St. Matthew's or another school during the regular school year.

Space is limited and early registration is advisable. All courses offered are subject to a minimum enrollment of 5 students. We are not able to offer students extra days in order to make up missed classes. There are no refunds for sessions partially completed, vacation days, or sick days.

The Summer Preschool Program

The Summer Preschool Program takes full advantage of St. Matthew's beautiful park-like setting. Carefully designed activities and a generous teacher-student ratio provide for the young child's enjoyment, growth, and safety at all times. The summer program provides a comfortable transition between the child's familiar program of the past year and the new challenge of the year to come.

The Preschool I Program concentrates on making the transition from the toddler classroom to the preschool classroom. Special emphasis is given to personal-social development and communication skills. If this is your child's first group experience, we strongly encourage that his or her enrollment be during the first three weeks (June 23-July 10) or during the full five week session (June 23 - July 24). To be eligible for the summer Preschool I Program, boys need to be 3 years of age by June 1, 2008 and girls need to be 3 years of age by September 1, 2008. The program is not staffed or furnished to handle diaper changing. Thus, preschool students in the summer program need to be reliable about taking care of their own toileting needs. The Preschool II Summer Program aims to enhance and expand the four and five year old's previous school experience. Activities will center around meaningful, seasonal themes. To participate in the Preschool II Program, children need to have had one year's experience in a preschool program. Additionally, boys must be four years of age by June 1, 2008 and girls must be four years of age by September 1, 2008.

At both levels, adventures in science, cooking, music, movement, art, language arts, and math encourage the children to explore, to discover, to learn, and to have fun!

Schedule & Fees for Preschool

The Preschool Summer Program runs Monday through Thursday mornings from 8:30-11:30 a.m. Students may attend the morning session for all five weeks, three weeks, or two weeks. There is no afternoon program at the preschool level. Please see Preschool Registration form.

The Summer Preschool Program is open to all age-eligible children, whether they attend St. Matthew's or whether they attend another preschool program during the regular school year. St. Matthew's preschool students enrolled for the regular fall program will receive preference until April 28, 2008.

Kindergarten Morning Program

Would you like your child to have summer weeks filled with Marvelous Mondays, Terrific Tuesdays, Wonderful Wednesdays, Thrilling Thursdays, and Fun Fridays? Then join the Kindergarten summer program in our beautiful Kindergarten facilities! A thematic curriculum integrates language arts, math, science, social studies, music, and art. Your child will begin his/her day by participating in language and math calendar activities during group time. This will be followed by participation in learning centers that focus on beginning phonics, numbers concept development, patterns, logic, creativity, and fine motor skills. There will also be plenty of time for outdoor play in the newly designed Kindergarten play yard. Permeating the entire Kindergarten experience is a strong emphasis on developing social skills, problem solving, and adapting to the new routines at the Kindergarten grade level.

Class size is small. Early registration is recommended. St. Matthew's students enrolled for the regular fall Kindergarten program will receive preferred status until April 28.

The Kindergarten Afternoon Program

The Kindergarten Afternoon Program will give children an opportunity to participate in exciting thematic activities that include movement, drama, art, cooking, science, and music. Students will have a rest time and enjoy literature, group games, and outdoor play. Students will also swim on Tuesdays and Thursdays, supervised by a certified instructor, the classroom teacher, and student aides.

Grades 1 and 2

Program for the Younger Set

Morning: Program for the Younger Set

Children entering first and second grade in the fall will participate in a program designed especially for them. For the first two hours of the morning, the boys and girls are part of a core class that explores the following activities:

Fun with Literature provides an opportunity to read and discuss award-winning books appropriate for beginning readers, enjoy hands-on activities related to the stories, and develop comprehension and thinking skills. Children will express ideas and feelings through creative writing activities, art projects, and dramatic role-playing.

Hands-On Math allows students to explore math through manipulative materials, mathematical games, and activities, which are designed to strengthen computational skills and problem solving. These activities include counting, estimation, probability, patterning, classifying, sequencing, and graphing.

For the third period in the morning, prospective first and second graders select one of the following classes:

Kid's Computer – We're going to have fun playing, typing, exploring, and finding out all the neat things that kids can do on a computer! Aimed at the younger set, this class will let kids get their hands on the machines in a safe environment and really get their feet wet (but not the computers!) in the world of technology!

Arts and Crafts – Looking for something different? Explore art through clay, sculpture, weaving, mosaic tiles, and model construction. This hands-on class will enable students to complete and take home projects that document successful, creative experiences and provide a boost in self-esteem!
