INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

PURPOSE: The Architectural Education Foundation of AIA Wyoming (AEF of AIA Wyoming) Scholarship Committee awards scholarships to deserving Wyoming residents or Wyoming high school graduates. To be eligible, students must have completed three or more semesters in a program leading to an accredited degree in Architecture or has or will graduate with an Architectural Engineering degree from the University of Wyoming and has been accepted by an accredited school of architecture.

Invitations will be sent to all NAAB Accredited Programs in Architecture, all Wyoming high schools, all AIAS Chapters, the University of Wyoming, and to area newspapers. Eligible students may request the application package after January 15, 2006.

PROCEDURE: Applicant must submit a personal letter stating need, qualifications and desire, a completed application form, resume, and a letter of recommendation from one faculty member. The AEF of AIA Wyoming Scholarship Committee must receive entries not later than May 2, 2006.

EVALUATION: The award(s) will be based on the applicant's potential for completing the program and entering the profession of architecture, desire and determination, overall ability, and need.

NOTIFICATION: Notification of awards will be made no later than June 30th and announced at the AIA Wyoming Spring Meeting in June. The scholarship will be distributed directly to the recipient's school for disbursement.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Each applicant must submit the following information. Failure to complete each item will disqualify the applicant. Additional materials submitted beyond those requested will not be considered and will not be returned.

All materials shall be submitted on unbound, 8 1/2" x 11", single face sheets only.

1. Cover Letter: This letter should introduce the applicant and explain their reasons for applying, financial need, professional goals, and reasons in which they feel they would be deserving of the 2006 Christopher Robin Hard Scholarship.

2. Application Form: Form provided.

3. Transcript: Provide an official transcript of their college record from their school.

4. Resume: Provide a personal resume listing complete educational background, employment history, extra curricular activities, and architecturally related travel.

5. Example of Work: Provide a maximum of six 8 1/2" x 11" examples of recent architecturally related work completed by the applicant.

6. Letter of Recommendation: Provide a letter from a faculty member recommending the student for the scholarship. This letter shall be submitted in a sealed envelope addressed to AEF of AIA Wyoming and included inside the applicant's package.
