Before unloading at the show, animals must be checked by the vet and may arrive only during designated times. There will be no exceptions. Entry fee \$2.00 per animal. Please send entry fee with your registration form. Entry forms and fees are due July 22, 2007. All late entries will be \$5.00 per animal. Animals may arrive between 5 and 8 pm - Thursday, August 2nd or between 8 and 9 am on August 3rd. Bedding is provided and Blue Seal will be providing grain. Animals will be released Sunday August 5th at 6 p.m. Bring your own fork. etc. You are responsible for cleaning your animal's area of the building before leaving Sunday. Please use this list in filling out the registration form for the 4-H/Youth dairy show.

OTHER INFORMANTION

All Animals exhibited must be owned or leased by 4-H'er and must have been cared for by the 4-H'er since May 1, 2006.

All 4-H shows will be judged on the Danish System. Rosettes, trophies or halters will be awards given in various shows

The 4-H dairy project is a 4-H member activity. Members only should care and prepare the animal for the show.

You may enter only one animal in each of the individual age classes.

All 4-H participants must enter the Fitting & Showmanship Class as the conformation classes.

Every Animal exhibited should be shown with a leather show halter.

4-H participants must be dressed neatly while showing. White pants and White shirts are used in showing Dairy animals.

All entries in 4-H Fitting & Showmanship classes will be judged on the appearance of the exhibitor ability of exhibitor to control animals, condition of animal and preparation of animal to show.

Only junior calves may have horns/stubs-less than two inches will be allowed.
4-H'ers are responsible for keeping own area clean and leaving it clean at end of show
